RE: **2022 Oneida County Tax Bills**

2022 Oneida County tax bills are currently being mailed out. If you have not received your tax bill, you should contact the County or your local municipality Treasurer. Remember, State law states you must pay your taxes and pay them on time, even if you did not receive a tax bill. You can find the 2022 Oneida County tax information, including the tax bill, on the Ascent Land Records website here: <https://ascent.co.oneida.wi.us/LandRecords/> Enter your parcel number with any necessary hyphens, and no spaces. Ascent Land Records will also show payments received by Municipalities.

**Please note:** Due to staff shortages and high sales, the Land Information Office is delayed in processing recorded deeds to the tax roll. Property sales that occurred after August 1, 2022 may not be updated to the 2022 tax roll yet. If your property has not been updated, this may be the reason. New property owners (for sales after 8/1/2022) will need to get the tax bill from the sellers, or by going online to view and/or download a PDF of the bill. This is an ongoing process and deeds are being processed daily.

You must pay at least the first installment listed on the tax bill on or before January 31<sup>st</sup> to your Local Town/City treasurer. Make sure that your check and envelope are made out to the municipality, and mailed directly to them. Municipality addresses are on the coupon. If you send the first payment to the County office by mistake, we will forward your payment at the end of January.

If you miss the payment deadline, or if you pay less than the amount due, your taxes will be delinquent. You will be charged 1.5% penalty and interest per month on the total unpaid tax amount. More importantly, however, you will lose the option of making your second half payment in July.

Now is also the time to be sure you are certified for the Lottery and Gaming Credit. Please check your tax bill. The amount of the Lottery and Gaming Credit appears in the middle of your tax bill, right above the Net Property Tax calculation. If you have not received the Lottery Credit and meet the requirements, contact your local treasurer. They will see that you receive a claim form. This form is also available at the County website, under Departments, Treasurer. You must sign and return the form to your local treasurer before you can be certified for and receive the Credit. You are only allowed one credit. It must be property that was owned by you **and** was your primary residence on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 to be eligible for the credit. This form must be in the hands of the local treasurer by January 31<sup>st</sup> to receive the credit off the current tax bill.
